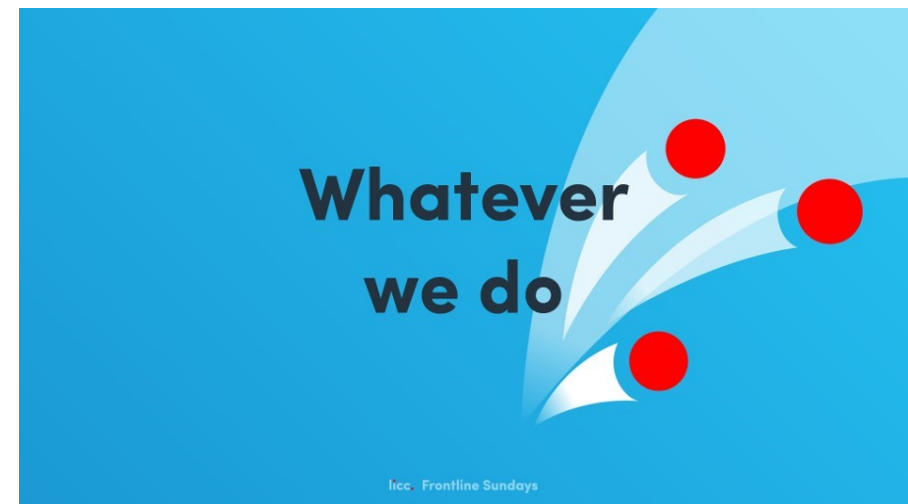

As the situation continues to evolve our Trustees & Management Team are in regular discussions as to whether we will be able to safely host our Camps this year, while keeping within the Government Guidance for large gatherings.

Should we have to cancel, to follow the Government Guidance as we cannot host Camps safely this year, full refunds or the option to hold the booking over until Summer 2021 will be given.
