Hardship Fund

Throughout scripture there is an emphasis on God's provision for his people, and because of his character God does not just give, but gives generously. For example: the new life Jesus came to bring us is both abundant and eternal! In the Old Testament the Children of Israel were instructed to treat foreigners the same as their own family. Deuteronomy 10:18-19 (CEV) The LORD defends the rights of orphans and widows. He cares for foreigners and gives them food and clothing. And you should also care for them, because you were foreigners in Egypt. In the New Testament Jesus himself told his disciples about the value of just a cup of cold water when given for Kingdom purposes in Mark 9:42. God's love knows no bounds. 1 Tim 2: 4-5 (CEV) ***God wants everyone to be saved and to know the whole truth, which is, There is only one God, and Christ Jesus is the only one who can bring us to God.***

So that we, as a church, can demonstrate God's love and his generosity to others, in a practical way, the church has set up a fund to which you may contribute. It is called the Hardship Fund and it will ensure that our church can respond rapidly should the need arise. It will be administered by a small group of people to include a member of the Missional community, a Deacon and a Trustee. Hardship is defined as circumstances in which a person or persons cannot maintain debt repayments and/or bills as the amount they need to pay each week or month is more than the amount of their income, due to a circumstance beyond their control. In all cases help will be offered in addition to the good news of the Kingdom.

This fund is to alleviate hardship in Jesus' name. There are people in our town who are in need food, or are without some vital piece of equipment in their home like a heater or some means of warming food. You may have heard in the news that Albanian migrants landed in Dawlish, just before Christmas, they were given food and prayed for by a member of our church, because there was provision for them to act quickly.

Donations should be made to the usual church bank account and reference made to Hardship Fund; placed in the offering (when we can meet again); or given directly to the Church treasurer in a clearly marked envelope. Thank you.

James 2: 15-17 (CEV) ***If you know someone who doesn't have any clothes or food, you shouldn't just say, "I hope all goes well for you. I hope you will be warm and have plenty to eat." What good is it to say this, unless you do something to help? Faith that doesn't lead us to do good deeds is all alone and dead!***
